

Menu Items / Sponsored Items

Menu items and DVHCP sponsored items will differ slightly this year. Menu items are a list of classes and activities that Learners can choose from for a greatly reduced group cost and are "self supported", meaning that the budget is established by the amount of funds generated by the number of Learners enrolled. Sponsored items are opportunities where the program actually incurs part of the cost of those classes and activities. If you are interested in participating in any of these opportunities, check with the Educator for availability in the classes, then call the Delta Vision Office to get your name on the list. Some of the offerings have limited space. The price listed will indicate whether it is a semester or yearly charge. Each learner will need to include the item on the current month's funding summary as a funds transfer.

Menu Items

Accelerated Reader - \$10 per year- This will give you access to over 100,000 reading practice quizzes, 10,000 vocabulary quizzes and 1,000 literacy quizzes.

Choir - \$100 per semester - This class meets once and week for 7 – 18 year olds (two separate classes) and performs at the Celebration of Learners in December and the Vision Fair in April. Min 5, Max 15 learners. Talk to Paul Frazier for more details.

Day Field Trips - \$20 per year - These monthly day trips will focus on the Delta - Montrose area. Talk to Jennifer Quinn for more details.

Powderhorn- \$130 - Ski school for three days usually in February. This will include the lift, lesson and rentals.

Teen Night - \$100 per semester - This a planned, monthly activity for Learners 13 - 18 years. Ask Marie for more details.

Weekly Reader Current Events - \$10 a year - This is for a periodical with approximately 8 - 10 pages of current events that comes on a weekly basis. Middle and High school level.

Sponsored Items

ACT Prep Class - \$150 per year (curriculum not included) - This class helps Juniors prepare for the Act test in the spring. Practice tests will be given several times during the course of the class to see what concepts need to be brushed up on and track improvement. Biology Lab - \$150 per year - Science Lab will be offered every week for two hours (Tuesdays from 1p.m. to 3p.m.). The Learner must currently be in a high school level Biology class or have taken one in the past. Talk to Donna Owen for more details

Civics - \$100 (curriculum is an additional \$10)- This class would focus on government at the local, state and national levels. They will cover topics like citizen action and leadership. 9-12 grade. This is offered second semester only. Talk to Angela Toothaker for more details.

Colorado CSAP coach - \$15 per subject set (set includes subject area questions and teacher answer key) - Complete test prep program for Reading and Math for grades 3 - 10th. Check out their website www.triumphlearning.com.

Journalism - \$150 second semester only (curriculum included) - min of 5 max of 10 learners. This class will teach different journalism techniques, as class projects, and produce a school newspaper. Class will include 30 classroom hours and 30 project and assignment hours for the semester. 1/2 credit offered. 8-12 grade.

R.E.A.C.H. - \$400/semester Non-Refundable - Cost includes all supplies that will be needed to complete service projects and related activities, cost DOES NOT include student's individual curriculum.- Class is for 6-8 graders & 9-12 graders

The learner attends class Monday through Thursday from 8:00am-10:00am. Individual lessons for the week must have been pre-assigned by the student's primary mentor prior to the beginning of the week. While in attendance, learners will work to complete the daily assignments made by their individual primary mentor, conduct themselves appropriately, participate in the weekly 21st Century Skills lesson including the completion of any homework given for the lesson, and actively participate in the community service projects which are tied into the 21st Century Skills lessons. A separate agreement (different from the Vision agreement) must be signed outlining the specific requirements in order to participate in REACH. While both Middle School and High School classes are held at the same time in the same building, different classrooms will be used. Daily work that is done in class, (other than the 21st Century Skills lessons), is counted in the Weekly Journal as "outside hours" for each specific subject worked on that day. Regular Labs - \$100 a year per lab - We will offer weekly labs for Math, and Foreign Languages (including Spanish, French and German), Reading and Writing. These labs offer help in these subject areas apart from the class they are taking.

Study Island -\$10 per year - Study Island is a leading provider of web-based state assessment preparation programs and standards based learning programs. Study Island is an excellent program that allows students to work independently and to address skills specific to their needs.

Yearbook Class - \$150 per year – The Yearbook Class will be responsible for taking pictures of most of the VISION events and activities and organize the class picture days. The class will then design and assemble the 2009/2010 yearbook using all the pictures that were taken throughout the year. Talk to Jennifer Quinn for more details.

Vanguard Ventures - \$100 per semester – Every Thursday afternoon there will be planned activities at eight different locations each month. The first week the learner can choose between ice skating at the Glacier in Grand Junction or group games and activities at the Rec Center (Elem age learners only). The second week of the month the choice is between golf lessons at the Cedaredge Golf Course or art lessons at The Creamery Arts Center in Hotchkiss. The third Thursday will include ceramic activities at Fat Cat Pottery or mini classes taught at The Math and Science Center in Grand Junction. The fourth Thursday choices will be local history facts at the Delta County Historical Society (middle school to high school ages only) or various fun and educational attractions in the Grand Junction area! The choices the learner makes each week need to stay the same for the semester. Changes can be made if the learner wishes for second semester.
